Expanded form

744 = 7 hundreds 4 tens 4 ones  
 - 236 = 2 hundreds 3 tens 6 ones

- Remember: Always start subtracting from the ones column so that if need arises, we can borrow from the tens column.

Step 2: Now, we break the tens as 4 tens = 3 tens + 1 ten

Hundreds	Tens	ones
7	3+1 4	4
-2	3	6

Expanded form

744 = 7 hundreds 3 tens 1 ten 4 ones  
 - 236 = 2 hundreds 3 tens 6 ones

Step 3: We borrow 1 ten (= 10 ones) from tens.

After borrowing, 4 ones become 14 ones.

Now, we can subtract the ones,  $14 - 6 = 8$

7	3	14
-2	3	6

Expanded form

744 = 7 hundreds 3 tens 14 ones  
 - 236 = 2 hundreds 3 tens 6 ones  
 8 ones
