Every sentence consists of two parts:

SUBJECT: The subject in a sentence is the person or thing we speak


about.


Example: <u>Ashok</u> is an intelligent boy. (We are talking about Ashok.)

Ashok, therefore, is the subject.

PREDICATE: What we speak about the subject, forms the predicate.

Example: Ashok <u>is an intelligent boy</u>.(predicate)
