

Learning Outcome:

- Student will understand the difference between subject and predicate.

Every sentence consists of two parts:

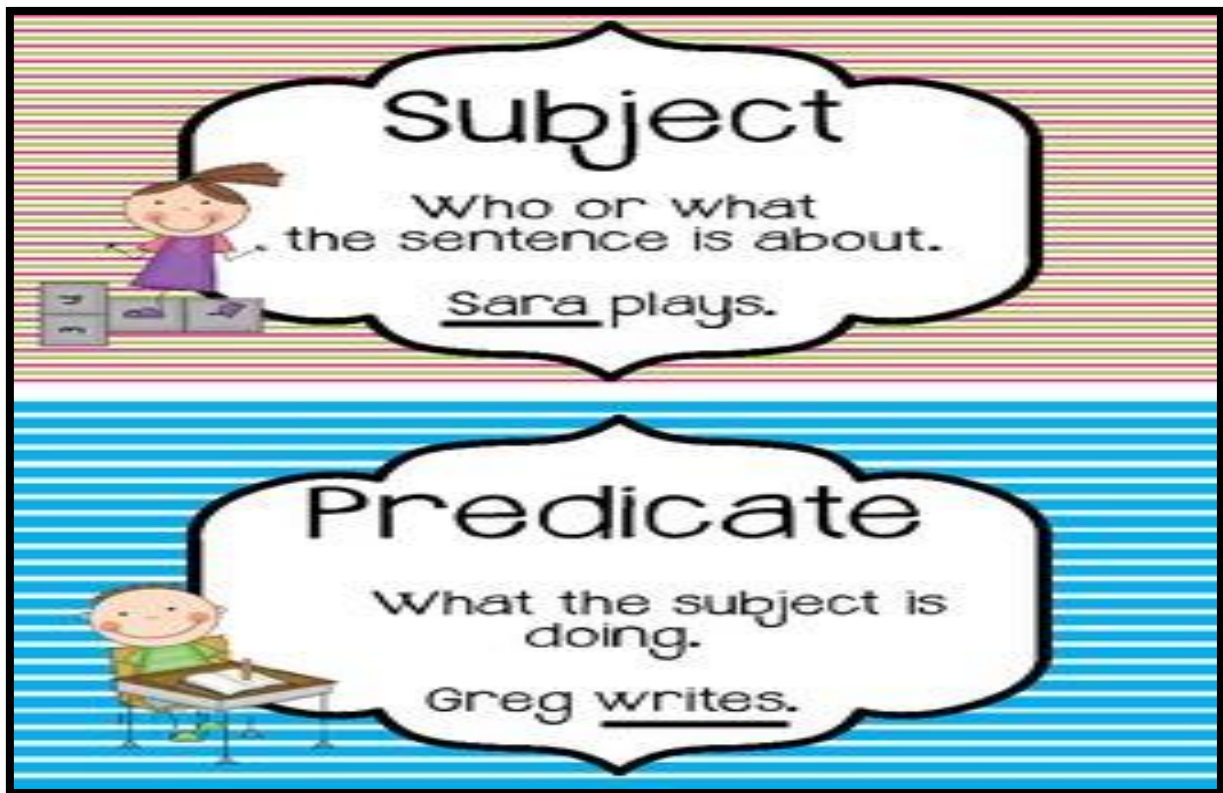
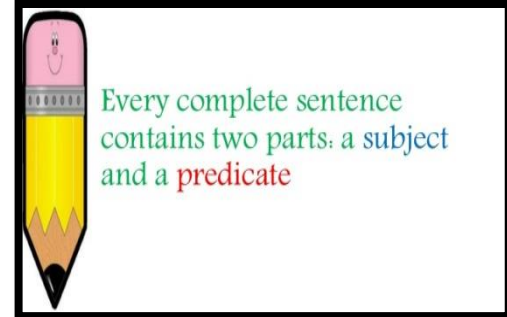
SUBJECT: The subject in a sentence is the person or thing we speak about.

Example: Ashok is an intelligent boy. (We are talking about Ashok.)

Ashok, therefore, is the subject.

PREDICATE: What we speak about the subject, forms the predicate.

Example: Ashok is an intelligent boy. (predicate)
